

# National Task Force on Pickleball Noise

## Ordinances with setback recommendations

- Torrance, California , minimum 250 feet setback ([Ordinance No. 3931](#))
- Centennial, Colorado, minimum 250 feet setback ([Ordinance No. 2023-O-10](#))
- Denver, Colorado. Minimum 350 feet setback ([Parks and Rec Advisory and Planning Group](#))
- Park City, Utah, requirements for private courts ([Ordinance No. 2022-08](#))
- Sagaponack, requirements for private courts, New York ([§245-34.S](#))
- Winter Park, Florida ([Ordinance No 3351-25](#)) , specifically mentions masonry walls for sound barriers
- Estero Florida, process for pickleball noise complaints ([Ordinance 2022-15](#))

## Ordinances that prohibit pickleball courts

- Jupiter Island, FL ([Ordinance 389](#)), specifically prohibits pickleball courts at single family dwellings
- Carmel-by-the Sea, CA ([Ordinance 2025-004](#)) prohibits pickleball at public courts, pending additional study.

## Ordinances that specifically address impulsive noise:

- Rollingwood, TX ([Ordinance 2024-01-17-12](#)), “Averaging techniques such as equivalent-continuous and maximum fast exponential time weighted sound pressure levels (LAeq and LAmx) are not permitted for the noise measurement of pickleball noise” Measurement procedures based on the adjusted sound exposure level according to ANSI S12.9 (Quantities And Procedures For Description And Measurement Of Environmental Sound), Part 4 (Noise Assessment and Prediction of LongTerm Community Response) shall be used to measure noise levels.
- New York City, NY ([Noise ordinance 24-299](#)) addresses impulsive noise
